PROCLAMATION

VETERAN AND MILITARY SUICIDE PREVENTION AND AWARENESS YEAR

WHEREAS, the men and women who have served or are currently serving in the military are the most honorable and extraordinary members of our nation and its states; and a service member, after their immeasurable sacrifice, should be welcomed home and receive a grateful and dignifying life filled with love and care; and

WHEREAS, military service, while noble, increases the risk of behavioral health challenges due in part to the high stress aspects of service and deployment, chief among these concerns is the elevated risk of suicide for both veterans and actively serving military members; annually, suicide takes the lives of over 6,000 veterans and military members in the United States and many in North Dakota — a suicide rate more than 50% higher than the general public; and

WHEREAS, the safety and wellness of veterans and military members is a priority in the state of North Dakota and all North Dakotans are encouraged to raise their awareness of the warning signs of mental health crises and the treatments available so that more people will be knowledgeable of how to save the lives of endangered persons; and

WHEREAS, the American Legion's "Be The One" program creates opportunities for people to clearly connect with veterans struggling with the thought of suicide, by destigmatizing the fear of asking for mental support, providing peer-to-peer support and deploying FDA-approved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find them the resources needed for their support; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Challenge, led by ND Cares in partnership with federal, state and community leaders, looks to prevent suicide among veterans, actively serving military members and their families by increasing screenings for risk, promoting better connectedness and care transitions, training veterans to be peer support specialists, educating health care and mental health providers about military culture and evidence based treatment methods and providing education about lethal means safety; and

WHEREAS, for those struggling with mental health-related distress and unable to speak with a loved one, the 988 Suicide and Crisis hotline is a valuable, accessible and free resource which can be called or texted at any time or accessed online through 988lifeline.org; and

WHEREAS, North Dakotans are encouraged to learn about the American Legion's "Be The One" program, the Governor's Challenge to prevent suicide among veterans, military members and their families and the 988 Suicide and Crisis hotline to increase their awareness and understanding of the challenges veterans and military members face and so that by any of these means they might assist in the saving of our veterans' and military members' lives.

NOW, THEREFORE, as Governor of the State of North Dakota, I do hereby proclaim 2024, VETERAN AND MILITARY SUICIDE PREVENTION AND AWARENESS YEAR in the State of North Dakota.

Edward Nesheim Memorial Scholarship

The Edward O. Nesheim Memorial Scholarship was created by his daughter, Sonja Adahl, in 2008 to honor the memory of her late father. Information about Edward O. Nesheim is available from The American Legion Foundation, Department of North Dakota. The Scholarship may be used at any post secondary institution of higher education in North Dakota granting Associate or higher degrees. Deadline April 1, 2023.

Hattie Tedrow Scholarship to High School Seniors

Applicant must be a legal resident of ND, a high school senior and a direct descendant of a veteran with honorable service in the US military. The scholarship is for post-high school study only. Maximum amount per scholarship award is \$2,000. Deadline April 1, 2023.

ND American Legion Riders Scholarship

Applicant must be a son, daughter, step-son, step-daughter, grandson or granddaughter for a veteran or active duty service member and must be accepted into a ND degree granting institution, including a University or Trade school. Deadline April 1st.
