#### 2023 Open Your Heart Dates

#### Saturday, December 2nd, 2023

Target Shopping Day. This event starts at 0730 and concludes around 1030. This event provides a specific dollar amount, depending on the number and age of children, to families to spend on clothing for their children. Legionnaires are involved with greeting families and retrieving receipts from the cashiers.

#### Monday, December 18th, 2023

0900-1100. Basket assembly. Volunteers are needed to assemble Cashwise food boxes. It is a simple process but large volume (1,600). These are the boxes that will be filled by the volunteers the evening of Friday, December 20 th , 2023.

#### Tuesday, December 19th, 2023

0800-1030. Volunteers are needed to sort, stack, and count all donated and purchased food items starting at 0800, in the Exhibit Hall of Bismarck Civic Center. Sorting, stacking, and counting is normally completed 1030. It involves examining donated food items and sorting them to the pre-labeled tables. Once the sorting is complete, the volunteers move to the labelled tables and count the items on each table. These counts are used to determine the quantities to be given to each family size.

1830-2030. Volunteers are needed to pack baskets for the families. Tables are already setup from the morning session. Volunteers are needed to manage the organization of the filled basket drop off area, the consolidation of baskets, the food tables, and to carry baskets to be filled.

#### Wednesday, December 20th, 2023

1000 -2000 (or until all delivered). Delivery Day. Volunteers are needed to position filledbaskets to stations inside the Exhibit Hall and load them into vehicles as they arrive. In addition, drivers using their own vehicle are needed throughout this timeframe to deliver baskets to the designated families. You can make one delivery or as many as you desire.
