Committee Reports:

Financial: Available cash for office use \$49,481, \$370,000 in bonds and \$107,000.00 in CD's. Gaming Foundation dollars to be used for donations \$629,658.00 and gaming Post 1 admin to be used for post expenses \$32,203. Gaming checks for BSC and Quilts of Valor were given Russ Kroshus and Ed Stern for presentation.

Gaming Report:

Quilts of Valor: \$4,000.00. 18 post 1 members have received a quilt from the quilts of valor.

BSC Scholarship Foundation: \$15,000.00 – should get our total up to \$50,000 to give out two scholarships in the future. History behind this scholarship: Post 1 started this last year with \$20,000 and BSC matched 50% which put us up to \$30,000. Ed Stern had a conversation with the foundation and in order for them to give out scholarships, they need to be in 25,000 increments. BSC is again matching 50%. Post 1 just approved \$15,000, BSC will match \$7500. This will put the Post 1 total up to \$52,500 and we should be able to give out two \$25,000 scholarships. BSC has a good process/program for the scholarships and an agreement has been signed between Post 1 and BSC.

SW Art Gallery and Science Center: \$10,000 – Gaming Committee did not support (outside our community). A motion was made by Ed Stern to approve the Gaming Report, second by Bob Wefald. Motion Carried.

Membership: Post 1 is at 77.91% (462). Goal is 593.

Veteran Service Officer:

The VA is reviewing the lease for the Bismarck CBOC (Community Based Outpatient Clinic). They want to increase the size of the clinic to 25,000-30,000 square feet. The current space is slightly less than 10,000 square feet.

The Wreaths Across America event at the North Dakota Veterans Cemetery will begin at 11:00 a.m. Saturday, December 16th. Traffic will probably be heavy, so early arrival is encouraged.

Slate of Officers:

Daniel Rustvang was accepted to the 1-year Executive Committee vacancy by the Executive Committee on 4Dec2023. *Mamie Havelka made a motion to confirm Danial Rustvang as 1-year Executive Committee member, motion second by Bob Wefald. Motion Carried.*

Historical Information by Bob Bird:

Loyd Spetz Post 1 Commander Arthur Allen Jones was born in 1881 in Kansas, passed away in 1942 in Washington and is buried at Arlington National Cemetery in VA. He was unanimously elected first Post 1 Commander of Loyd Spetz. His occupation was Chief Train Dispatcher/Brakeman. Commissioned as a Captain in Quartermaster Corps. Overseas in WWI from 18Aug1917 to 9Jan1919. He married Jenny Lind (Gustaveson) Jones in 1903. She was born in 1881 in MN, passed away in 1952 in WA, and is also buried at the Arlington National Cemetery, VA. While in Bismarck, ND, she was active in the Episcopal Church and the Eastern Star Lodge.
